Summer Camps

This year's Summer Camps will consist of **Great Beginnings** for grades Pre K- 2nd grade, **Great Escape** for grades 3rd -6th, and **Adventure Camp** for grades 7- 9. Great Beginnings, Great Escape Camp, and Adventure Camp will run the duration of 10 weeks, from 8:00am to 4:00pm with extended care options. A full day of activities will be provided to meet the needs of the children. In the morning the group will meet all together in one designated area. After reporting to their homeroom, each group will rotate through a block schedule, which includes sports and games, adventure, arts and crafts. We will then break for lunch at which time each group will report back to the designated homeroom area. After lunch the groups will rotate through electives which can consist of trust games, nature walks, scavenger hunts or group games. Each day will end with homeroom. **Great Beginnings will be held at Gilead Hill School. **There will be an additional Admission/Activities fee for trips** Registration forms will be on line.**

TOWN CLERK

We are preparing for the Municipal Election to take place on November 7th. This is the time of year we look to see which offices will appear on the ballot and minority representation. This month the town committees will hold their caucuses and will certify a list of endorsed candidates to the Town Clerk by July 26th. This list will be made available to the public upon request.

The Dog licensing season is well underway and as of this date we have licensed almost 800 dogs.

This department has been awarded a \$4,000 grant from the Connecticut State Library to be used to offset the cost of new shelving units for the second floor vault.
