#### JUNE IS DOG LICENSING MONTH

June is dog licensing month in Connecticut and Hebron typically licenses 1000 dogs each year. Dogs over the age of 6 months must be licensed. Proof from a veterinarian of neutering and of vaccination against rabies is required for all new dogs. Dogs that have been registered in previous years need proof of updated rabies vaccinations or if they have recently been neutered proof of the procedure. The fee for a neutered dog is \$8.00 and un-neutered dogs are \$19.00. If an owner is tardy and licenses their dog after the June 30th deadline there is a penalty fee of \$1 per month.

Licensing a dog can be done

through the mail. Send a copy of neutering and current vaccination records with your check payable to the Town of Hebron along with a double stamped selfaddressed envelope and we will mail the tag back to you. Remember to give us your phone number just in case we have questions.

The earliest known record of dog licensing was in 1446 in Holland. Farmers and sharecroppers would demand reimbursement from the town for livestock killed by roaming dogs. Local governments created the dog tax to provide a source of revenue to pay for these claims.

Current day tags show the year, the town's name and a number that is associated with the owner. When a lost dog is found the owner can quickly be located with the information provided the tag. Dog licensing also prevents the spread of rabies. State mandate of vaccinating against rabies before licensing provides the community with a safer population of our 4-legged friends.

Tag shapes and colors vary from year to year with some more elaborate than others. Many residents will eagerly

inquire as to what color and shape this year's tags are. Red is very popular and the most favorite number naturally is #1, and the least popular is #666. Though that number was once requested by an owner with a sense of humor who came home to find the family dog sitting in the middle of newly torn up favorite couch.

So if your dog is small or large, old or young, well behaved or mischievous make sure you license them with the town clerk in June.



#### **GRACIOUS OPEN SPACE** LAND DONATION

In August 2017, the Hebron Open Space Land Acquisition Committee recommended acceptance of a gracious 20.2-acre donation of land from the Alpert, Fisher, Goldstein Rosenbaum families. December 2017, the town approved this open space donation offer. The donated property preserves an extensive scenic, forested buffer between the Colchester Spur of the Air Line Trail and Route 85. The

land offers an opportunity for additional Trail parking and potential picnic area. The parcel is comprised mostly of woodlands and wetlands upgradient to Raymond Brook Marsh, a Wetlands of State-Wide Special Concern. Also, a portion of this property lies within the State's Natural Diversity Data Base map, showing an area of State and Federal Listed Species Significant Natural Communities.


#### TWO HEBRON OPEN SPACE ACQUISITIONS: **PROTECTING** THE SALMON RIVER

In January 2017, the Hebron Open Space Land Acquisition Committee voted to recommend a 47.5-acre open space purchase of the Fish parcel located on Gilead Street abutting Gilead Hill Elementary School for \$175,000. The parcel, located within the Fawn Brook Greenway, has a number of unique attributes that the Committee considered in

making its recommendation. The property contains a significant portion of Fawn Brook, a Class A watercourse and important tributary of the Salmon River and a portion of the Fawn Brook Marsh, a designated Wetlands of Special Concern. The parcel also contains a trail system that extends to Fawn Brook. An opportunity to connect this trail system to an existing trail at Gilead Hill Elementary School could provide for educational and recreational school use. This recommendation was approved at

> a Special Town Meeting in August 2017 and in December the town was notified of a State open space grant award covering 60%, or \$102,000, of the acquisition price.

In July 2017, based upon a recommendation from the Committee, the town approved the 10-acre Serra parcel acquisition. This property, abutting townowned space, open Salmon River State Forest and the Jeremy River, another

Class A watercourse and tributary of Salmon River, includes two trails that extend from Grayville Road to Jeremy River and provides a connection to the town-owned Grayville Falls Park. protecting the Jeremy River, the acquisition helps preserve an abutting historic sluiceway and mill remnants within the State Forest.

#### **ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT COMMISSION**


The Town's Economic Development Commission (EDC) has been busy over the last several months in supporting numerous projects to move the Town's community development goals forward. A few initiatives deserve some special focus.


The most substantial development project of the last several years is nearing completion. Colebrook Village at Hebron, a Senior Living Community, is getting set to open its doors this summer. This Community is a private facility offering independent living, assisted living, and memory care apartments in its brand new complex at the end of John E. Horton Boulevard. They kicked off their final phase of construction on May 5th with a "Hard Hat Party" for the Hebron community, and are progressing quickly for their grand opening soon.

In other news, the EDC will be spending time this summer participating in a "First Impressions" program developed by UConn and the Connecticut Main Street Center. Hebron's Main Street will be visited by residents and business owners from Durham, CT, a community of similar size and demographics. Hebron will send a corresponding small group of residents and business owners to Durham. Each group will spend a day visiting the Main Street area of the other community, taking note of its amenities, visitor-friendliness, and its shortcomings. They will report back to the program conveners and each community will get valuable feedback on how outsiders see our Town. It is hoped that this input can help the EDC and business owners focus on needed improvements, as well as feel good about the things we're doing well.

Finally, the EDC and Town Manager will be undertaking a schedule of business visitations throughout Town, to make sure the goals and efforts of local government are properly focused on helping our businesses growing. #### **DID YOU KNOW?**

At one time such items as household furniture, private libraries (books), musical instruments and personal jewelry was taxable. Under an old statute, CGS §1761, which was repealed pursuant to Public Act 51-54, effective October 1, 1951, (currently CGS §12-81), the following became exempt under sections; (31) Household furniture; (32) private libraries; (33) musical instruments, inclusive of radios and television sets; and (34) watches and jewelry; used by any individual and belonging to any family. Section (33) was just last year revised by Public Act 17-105 now including; cellular mobile telephones, computers and mobile electronic devised as defined in section 10-222d.

Reminder; a motor vehicle that had been disposed of or registered out of state after October 1, 2017 may be entitled to a pro-rate on the tax bill. The bills that will come out July 2018 are for vehicles registered from October 1, 2017 through September 30, 2018. If you disposed of or registered a vehicle out of state, AND canceled the license plates any time during that assessment year, in order to have your bill pro-rated we require copies of the canceled plate receipt AND some form of documentation as to what happened to the

vehicle. Please note that the DMV DOES NOT notify this office when the marker plates are canceled. As per §12-71c(b); in order to get a credit, documentation must be provided by December 31st immediately following the end of the assessment year which next follows the assessment year in which such vehicle is disposed of, ie.: for credits on the October 1, 2017 list, documentation must be received by December 31, 2019.

As always, the staff in the Assessor's Office is available to answer any questions or concerns you may have regarding the assessment process.

Your Best Friend. Our Best Medicine. THE FINANCE DEPARTMENT finally has some good news to report. The State has finally adopted a budget that the Governor actually signed off on and the Town's 2018-2019 fiscal year budget passed at its first referendum held on May 8th!! Thanks to all the taxpayers that came out to vote!

While this is definitely progress and the adoption of both the State and Town budgets currently reflects a return of State Aid Educational Cost Sharing revenue for both the 2017-2018 and 2018-2019 fiscal years, there is still a shortfall of other State Aid Grant revenue to the Town that will equate to \$993,876 for this fiscal year ending June 30th.

As previously reported, Hebron Elected Officials and Management staff have retained the soft spending freeze along with the directive for the Town to set aside \$200,000 in expenditures and the Hebron BOE to set aside \$350,000 which will cover half of the revenue shortfall. With this report, this goal should be achievable. Through frugal financial management and following Generally Accepted Accounting Principles and Governmental Accounting Standards Board Guidelines Hebron is fiscally sound and retains a healthy Fund Balance. The additional State revenue shortfall necessary to fulfill this fiscal year budget will be taken from the Fund Balance with no additional burden to our taxpayers.

With the adoption of the Town 2018-2019 budget of \$35,799,365, please bear in mind that the Town reduced its operating costs by \$395,862. We have once again eliminated some staff and combined responsibilities that may affect services. Everything will be a work in progress and staff will continue to present our community with all that is required and requested in our usual professional and efficient manner.

Once again, a HUGE THANK YOU to all that voted and participated in our 2018-2019 budget process. It greatly assists all Town and BOE staff in making difficult budgetary decisions. Have a glorious, relaxing summer!



#### **RECYCLING NEWS**

DUE TO COMPETITION in the Recycling industry, the Town of Hebron has been provided an opportunity to reduce fees charged to Hebron residents for disposal of white goods that contain refrigerants. This was voted on and approved at the Selectman's meeting on April 19, 2018. This includes air conditioners, dehumidifiers and refrigerators, which are now hauled away and recycled. Additionally, the vendor is now accepting florescent bulbs at no cost. Other large appliances are now being recycled into the metal dumpster for removal and the Town is compensated for this at the scrap market value. The fee for tire disposal was increased due to the cost the Town is charged by the disposal company. Passenger tires were increased by .25 cents to \$2.25 each and truck tires increased by \$1 to \$11 each. There is a chart for the fees for oversized tires that is available at the attendant's office.

The Town attempts to keep current with disposal rates to be fair to all residents. We encourage recycling, not only for environmental reasons but the more we recycle, the less we are charged for our waste stream. An example of this is the municipal solid waste. At this time, the Town is compensated \$15 per ton for the recycled items that are separated from this compactor and hauled separately. Over the course of a year, this adds up quickly.

The Department of Public Works will continue to inform the residents when any changes are made to the fee structure at the Transfer Station. Please assist with recycling whenever possible and we will all enjoy a more economical and environmental friendly place to live.

Food waste represents the largest single component in Connecticut's waste stream. So reducing the amount of food we throw away helps not only the environment but our wallets. One of the best and easiest ways to do this is through composting.

Composting turns organic waste (food scraps, leaves, etc.) into a useful end product. Homeowners can easily do this through a composting bin or place in your yard to put a pile, and the end result is rich, organic matter that adds nutrients to your property, retains moisture in the soil and keeps waste out of our Transfer Station.

Businesses have the option for onsite bins or having food waste hauled to a permitted processing facility





or local farm. Use of food waste as animal feed is one of the preferred methods by the CT DEEP.

Around town, RHAM is currently looking into their composting options for cafeteria food waste and the Library is installing a compost bin system for garden waste with food scrap contributions from Something Simple and the American Legion Hall.


should lead to a better community. These Actions not only provide us with credit for the steps we've already taken, but also provide a roadmap for future health and economic wellness of our town.



The goal of Park operations is to maintain quality facilities for the community and to ensure the highest level of safety for all participants. Park operations maintains the grounds, buildings and athletic fields at Burnt Hill Park, Veterans Memorial Park, St. Peter's field, Old Colchester Road field, and the Lion's


Fairgrounds soccer fields. We also mow and mulch Gilead Hill School, Hebron Elementary School, Burrows Hill Old School. Town Hall, The Horton House, The Russell Mercer Senior Center. Douglas Library, Old Town Hall, The Horton House, The Russell Mercer Senior Center. Douglas Library, Old Town Hall, AHM, five cemeteries, four Fire Department locations, Grayville

Park, Memorial Corner, Downtown and Commuter Parking Lot, Horton Blvd., seven Pump Stations, The Peters House, Public Works, and several intersections. Our responsibilities include overseeing more than 1,700 acres of Open Space and six miles of Town trail systems, which includes invasive plant management, clearing brush, trail repair, maintenance on the Skatepark at Veterans Memorial Park, servicing our park equipment,



snow removal on town sidewalks and building props for our community We also provide Turf management services for RHAM to improve the school's athletic fields. Recent projects include trail and parking area construction at Raymond Brook Preserve and the recently completed upgrades at Veterans Park completing baseball field reconstruction and the addition of dugouts for the softball fields.

In September, there will be a Membership Drive to invite more Hebron friends and neighbors who are




#### SUMMER AT DOUGLAS LIBRARY


