

FISCAL UPDATE

Thus far fiscal year 2018-2019 with an adopted budget of \$35,799,365 has begun smoothly for the most part. As the Town significantly reduced its operating costs by \$395,862, we have experienced a few snags such as realizing the Town Clerk's office could not function without two full time staff. Therefore, the BOS and BOF authorized the return of the reduced Assistant position to full time and may result in a budget shortage of approximately \$40,000 that may require a supplemental appropriation at year end. Hopefully we will experience a mild winter and this will be unnecessary! It also appears that the State reinstated some of the Educational Cost Sharing Grant revenue and the Municipal Stabilization Grant to Hebron for this fiscal year by \$316,056 dollars. However, we are hesitant to celebrate and incorporate this information as there will be a new Governor in office shortly and further State budgetary changes will likely occur.

The Finance Department also just presented in the "We Are Hebron Leadership" program to participating taxpayers interested in further educating themselves into the day to day operations and responsibilities of our various Town departments. As we received an overall evaluation of excellence, my staff and I were elated with the outcome and appreciate those individuals participating in this program.

The next Board of Finance meeting is scheduled for November 15th and hopefully this magazine mailing reaches all of you prior to. This will be an informative meeting where the BOF members will meet a Financial

Please make your voices heard and join us in creating a balanced budget that accommodates all!

MESSAGE FROM THE HEBRON TOWN CLERK:

Although all states have made provisions for absentee voting, the laws and requirements differ from state to state.

In Connecticut the Town Clerk is responsible for issuing absentee ballots for all voting events. There are many laws and many steps in the absentee voting process that protect your right to vote while ensuring some privacy and confidentiality.

The following process must be followed to obtain an absentee ballot for the most recent election held November 6, 2018.

The Regular Absentee ballot became available on October 5, 2018.

- 1) You are required to fill out an application and deliver it to the Town Clerk either in person, by USPS or by third party.
- 2) The application can be emailed or faxed but in addition to this step you must mail the original. The original application must be received by the close of the polls on election-day or your ballot will be rejected.
- 3) Upon receipt of the application the Town Clerk prepares the ballot and will either hand it to you or mail it via USPS.
- 4) You will receive the ballot, you vote and return it in person, by USPS or third party by the close of the polls on election day.

5) All ballots returned after the close of polls are rejected.

Common mistakes that result in a rejected ballot:

- 1) A voter leaves the ballot in our mail box or the Tax Collector's lock box.
- 2) The voter does not follow instructions and does not include the "B" envelope with the returned ballot.
- 3) The "B" envelope is not signed and dated.
- 4) The ballot is returned after the polls close.

The State of Connecticut has also made provisions for other types of absentee ballots.

- 1) Official Blank 90 Day Ballot is available 90 days prior to the election to registered electors in the military, their spouses and dependents with "special contingencies" only.
- 2) Official Blank 45 Day Ballot is available 45 days prior to the event. Used for Federal offices only for US citizens who are 18 years of age, not registered, residing outside the US and must have been a resident of Connecticut immediately prior to moving outside the US.
- 3) Official Blank 45 Day Ballot is available 45 days prior to the election. Used for registered voters temporarily living or expecting to be traveling overseas, all servicemen, spouses, and dependents whether living within or outside the US.
- 4) Regular Full Absentee Ballot is available 31 days prior to the event.

Wait there is more. The Registrars of Voters are authorized to issue

- 5) Provisional Ballots on election-day to those whose name does not appear on the updated list of electors. This allows the voter a paper ballot that will only be counted if the registrars are able to research the voter status and determine the ballot will be counted.
- 6) Same Day Registration Ballot is available on election day in the office of the Registrar, Town Office Building, 15 Gilead Street, Hebron, to people that missed all deadlines to register to vote but wish to register and vote on election-day.

The Town Clerks and Registrars of Voters take our responsibilities seriously and will do everything within our power to assist you with your constitutional right to vote.

HAPPY HOLIDAYS!

During the months of November and December this office is busy fine-tuning the real estate portion of the list and heavily working on the personal property and motor vehicle parts.

Personal Property Declarations were due by November 1st so the data entry for those are being processed during this time and, the regular motor vehicle file should be received from the Department of Motor Vehicles (DMV) and loaded during the first part of December.

Once the motor vehicle data is loaded, the pricing and adjustments will be done to finalize that list. Since 1993 and as per §12-71d of the Connecticut State Statutes, the Office of Policy and Management (OPM) has recommended the pricing for motor vehicles is done using 70% of the "Clean Retail" values from the October edition of the National Automobile Dealers Association (NADA) pricing guide. The use of information from the vehicle registration, such as the year, make, model and vehicle identification number (VIN) is used to match with the guide for pricing. Mileage is not information associated with a registration, therefore not reported to us; pricing is based on average mileage.

Reminder; the bills that will be due July 2019 are for vehicles registered from October 1, 2018 through September 30, 2019. If you disposed of or registered a vehicle out of state, AND canceled the license plates any time during that assessment year, in order to have your bill pro-rated we require copies of the canceled plate receipt AND some form of documentation as to what happened to the vehicle. Please note that the DMV DOES NOT notify this office when the marker plates are canceled. As per §12-71c(b); in order to get a credit, documentation must be provided by December 31st immediately following the end of the assessment year which next follows the assessment year in which such vehicle is disposed of, ie.: for credits on the October 1, 2016 list, documentation must be received by December 31, 2018.

As always, the staff in the Assessor's Office is available to answer any questions or concerns you may have regarding the assessment process.



FALL REMINDERS

As the leaves are turning colors and falling off the trees, we are reminded that the winter season is almost upon us. Before we talk about that though, I would like to share a few reminders for residents.

The Public Works Department would appreciate your help in keeping the catch basin grates and drainage ditches clear of leaves. When they clog the drains, street flooding occurs, causing dangerous driving conditions and possible damage to properties.

Another issue that is becoming a frequent problem is with regard to the sewer system. When non flushable items, such as swifters or hygiene products, enter the system, they clog the pumps causing expensive repairs. Commercials advertise that these items don't harm anything, but I have seen the outcome and the bills incurred to remedy the issues. It is very expensive. Grease is another product that should not be poured into the sewer system. Our main pump stations have seen significant damage caused by this.

And lastly we can discuss our winter hazards. We like to remind residents every year, that before the snow flies, portable basketball hoops have to be removed from the side of the road. The hoop that extends into the travel lane is a hazard and can cause damage to passing vehicles and equipment. Please be sure that the structure is placed well off the roadway as to not interfere with traffic. Another obstacle that the snow plows face is the placement of garbage cans. We are responsible for clearing the snow back to the curb and the garbage cans should be placed accordingly. Also, please ask your subcontractor not to plow across the roadway and leave excess snow in the street as this is a violation of State Statute. This causes extra work for our plows and we have enough to keep us busy. And with regard to safety, we would like to remind everyone not to allow children to play in the snow banks along the street. Although they make an attractive recreation area, the drivers cannot see the presence of a small child playing, especially if it's snowing. We hope that everyone enjoys the foliage that the fall brings, and I for one am wishing for a mild winter.





Hebron Interfaith Human Services (HIHS) operates a food pantry providing nutritional and other assistance to local residents. Approximately 90,000 pounds of food were distributed to 80 local families last year, according to Director Christa Goodwin-Babka.

HIHS also assists qualified clients in obtaining energy assistance during winter months. This support is afforded to individuals experiencing hardship, including medical or employment matters, accidents or other difficult circumstances.

HIHS received its IRS tax exemption as a qualified non-profit in 1990. The pantry was initially organized by local houses of worship and is still supported by the six churches and synagogue in town. Local civic organizations, the schools, and small businesses make donations of food or money to HIHS and many residents participate in workplace giving programs. The annual Boy Scout food drive nets 5000 lbs. of food each year. But the biggest source of funding according to board chairperson Rick White is the annual appeal, a town-wide mailing. "Hebron residents have always



responded with generosity and compassion" he added.

According to Ms. Goodwin-Babka, our strong and committed volunteer base is key to running a clean and well stocked pantry. In addition to offering food pick-up every two weeks, the pantry runs a student

"backpack program" whereby snacks and other food items are provided for school and weekend use. HIHS volunteers also staff the bi-weekly mobile food truck distributing vegetables and other food items on the grounds of The Church of Hope.

Upcoming events for HIHS include the Hebron Holiday Craft Fair at Hebron Elementary School on December 8th from 9:00-4:00. The "Stuff a Cruiser" (with toys) will also run on December 8th from 10:00-2:00 at Ted's market.




Parks and Recreation Enrichment Program "PREP"

PREP - Parks & Recreation Enrichment Program - continues to offer before and after school care for Hebron children in grades PRE K (3 or 4 year olds on or before December 31st of the current school year and fully potty trained) through 6th grade. Our goal at "PREP" is to provide a supportive, nurturing environment in which schoolage children can develop socially, emotionally, and physically, by encouraging positive self-esteem, self-respect, and problem-solving skills. 
