

Dear Homeowner,

The following items are prohibited from being discharged into the sanitary sewer system. Careful use of the system will help prevent increased operating costs.

Animal guts	Kerosene
Ashes	Land drains*
Asphalt	Manure
Blood (whole)	Metals
Bones	Oils (automotive, lubricating, machinery)
Cinders	Paint
Dye Wastes	Plastics
Diesel fuel, gas, petroleum	Rags
Dust (stone/marble)	Radioactive Waste
Entrails	Sodium Chloride*
Explosive materials	Roof downspouts*
Feathers	Sand
Fleshlings	Septic Waste (from existing septic tanks)
Gases	Shavings
Glass	Sodium Sulfate
Grass Clippings	Solvents
Grease (automotive, animal, cooking)*	Spent Lime
Guts	Storm Water
Hair	Straw
Lubricants (petroleum)	Sump Pumps*
Hides	Tar
Thinner, varnish	Vegetable-tanning solutions
Wax	Wood

Cat Litter should not be flushed down the system. Cat litter contains glass and the glass can ruin the pumps at the pumping stations. The pumps are very costly to replace or repair.

\*Grease: Cooking or animal grease should not be poured down the drain. Commercial establishments are required to maintain grease traps as part of the interior plumbing.

\*Sump pumps, curtain drains, roof drains are all illegal connections to the sewer system and should be disconnected immediately.
