Re: Docket No. 26-05-XX - Application of The Connecticut Light and Power Company d/b/a Eversource Energy to Amend its Rate Schedules – Notice of Intent

Dear Mr. Gaudiosi:

The Connecticut Light and Power Company d/b/a Eversource Energy (“Eversource” or the “Company”) submits this letter as preliminary notice to the Public Utilities Regulatory Authority (“PURA”) pursuant to R.C.S.A. § 16-1-22(b) that the Company intends to file an application to amend its existing distribution rates on or about July 14, 2026, in order to address an existing operating revenue deficiency of approximately \$503 million. The Company’s filing will request amended base distribution rates effective July 1, 2027, to be implemented following PURA’s 350-day statutory investigation. In recognition of PURA’s renewed engagement in developing a constructive regulatory platform that will promote the long-term interests of customers, the Company’s filing will present an integrated set of regulatory proposals targeting safety and reliability, cost efficiency and affordability, among other critical customer goals.

As the Company prepares its filing, it has become clear that the path forward for electric customers requires a creative, holistic, in-depth approach to achieve an outcome capable of powering Connecticut’s future at a cost that customers can manage and afford. This is no small feat. However, the Company’s filing will attempt to provide PURA with the opportunity to make a real and lasting difference for customers – and for the State of Connecticut – in relation to the delivery of safe, reliable, resilient and affordable electric service. As this letter explains, the kernels of success are already in place – shielding customers from larger bill impacts that would have otherwise occurred in the upcoming docket, absent certain mitigating factors.

⇒ **Drivers of the Revenue Deficiency**

The drivers of the Company’s revenue deficiency are not surprising, given the passage of time since PURA’s prior review of CL&P’s distribution rates in 2017/2018, which culminated in

PURA’s approval of the 2018 Rate Settlement effective May 1, 2018.¹ Approximately 50 percent of the operating revenue deficiency arises from the cost of investments in electric infrastructure used to deliver power to customers, with approximately \$600 million of the \$3.3 billion in net utility plant installed since 2017 for the benefit of customers not currently included in rates. In addition to enabling a high level of service reliability to residential and business customers, the Company’s investments in electric distribution infrastructure generate approximately \$240 million annually in state and local tax revenue for the 157 municipalities that Eversource serves in Connecticut.

The remaining 50 percent of the revenue deficiency arises from core operating needs, including increases in operating and maintenance (“O&M”) expense and vegetation-management costs, along with increased costs to restore the electric system after typical stormy weather conditions and to fund restoration and response efforts necessitated by larger, major weather events that arise more sporadically. For all of these cost changes, Eversource has the burden in the upcoming proceeding to present a well-supported and documented filing, allowing PURA to conduct its investigation with efficiency and clarity. Eversource plans to fulfill this obligation.

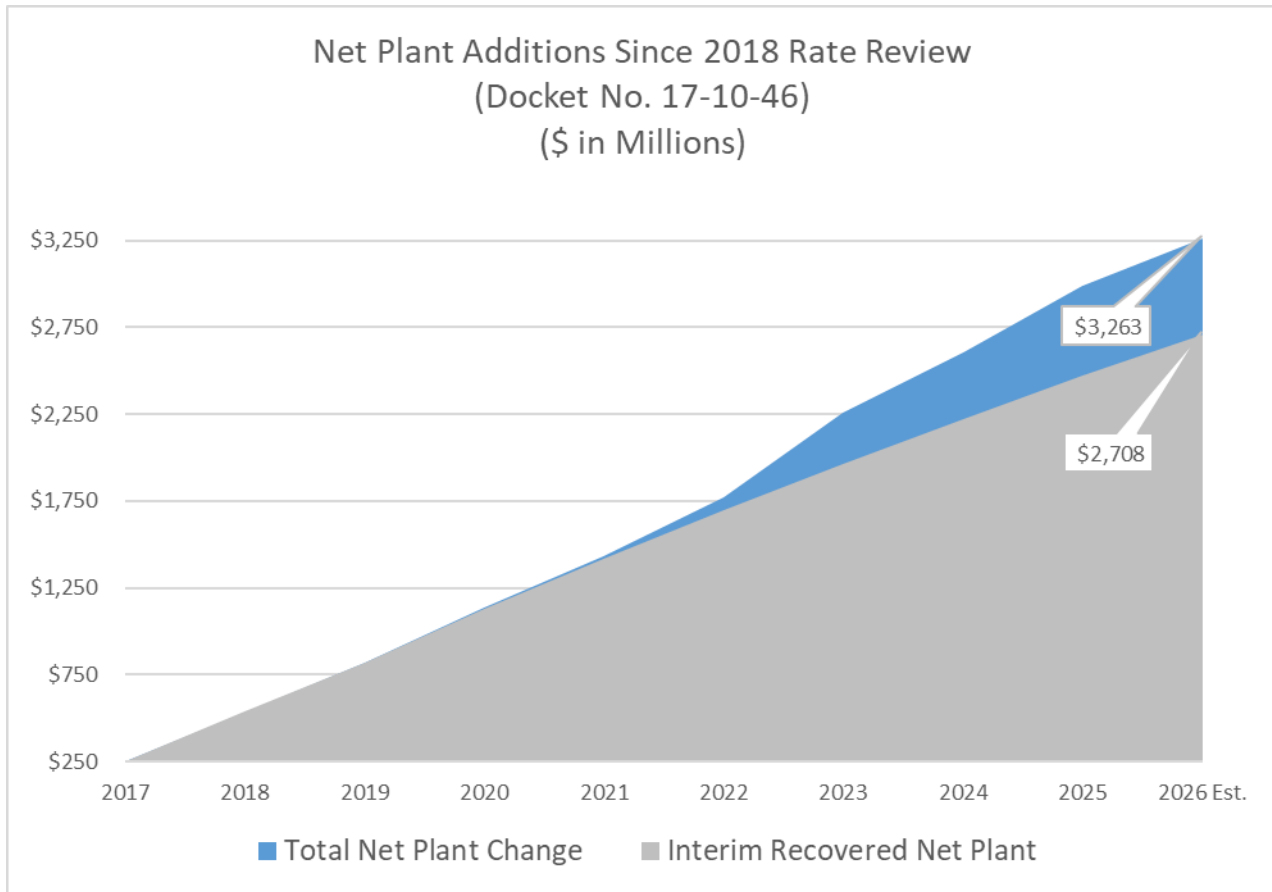
Importantly, two critical dynamics have occurred over the past eight years to temper the existing revenue deficiency for customers. Each of these dynamics will provide valuable guidance for the upcoming proceeding.

First, the 2018 Rate Settlement established a multi-year rate plan and the Electric System Improvements (“ESI”) rate recovery mechanism to permit recovery of costs incurred annually to upgrade, replace and reinforce electric distribution infrastructure for the benefit of customers.² Through the multi-year rate plan, the ESI rate was gradually increased such that the bill impact for customers was limited to less than \$2 per month each year, on average, over an 8-year period, 2018-2025, while allowing the recovery of the costs associated with \$2.7 billion of invested capital for infrastructure upgrades. This gradual roll-in of invested capital has greatly benefitted customers because – without the ESI – customers would now be facing a rate increase to accommodate \$3.3 billion of incremental net capital invested since the 2018 rate review, instead of the \$600 million that remains to be incorporated into rates over and above what the ESI will address through December 31, 2026. The mitigating impact of gradual increases accomplished through the ESI over the years 2018 to 2026 is illustrated in Figure 1, below. Only the area shaded in blue in Figure 1 remains to be incorporated into customer rates, demonstrating that the ESI rate mechanism has operated effectively to support needed capital investment on a year-to-year basis, while dramatically mitigating the bill impacts that customers will experience as a result of this distribution rate review.

¹ PURA conducted the Company’s prior distribution rate review in Application of The Connecticut Light and Power Company d/b/a Eversource Energy to Amend Its Rate Schedules, Docket No. 17-10-46, Decision, April 18, 2018, for rates effective May 1, 2018. In that docket, PURA approved a rate settlement (the “2018 Rate Settlement”) that, among other outcomes, established a multi-year rate plan covering the years 2018-2021. Aspects of the 2018 Rate Settlement remain in place today, stabilizing rates in what has turned out to be a very effective manner.

² The ESI allowed recovery of capital investment above \$270 million for the years 2018, 2019 and 2020, and for up to \$300 million in core capital placed in service in the years 2021 through 2025.

Figure 1: Net Plant Additions 2017-2026



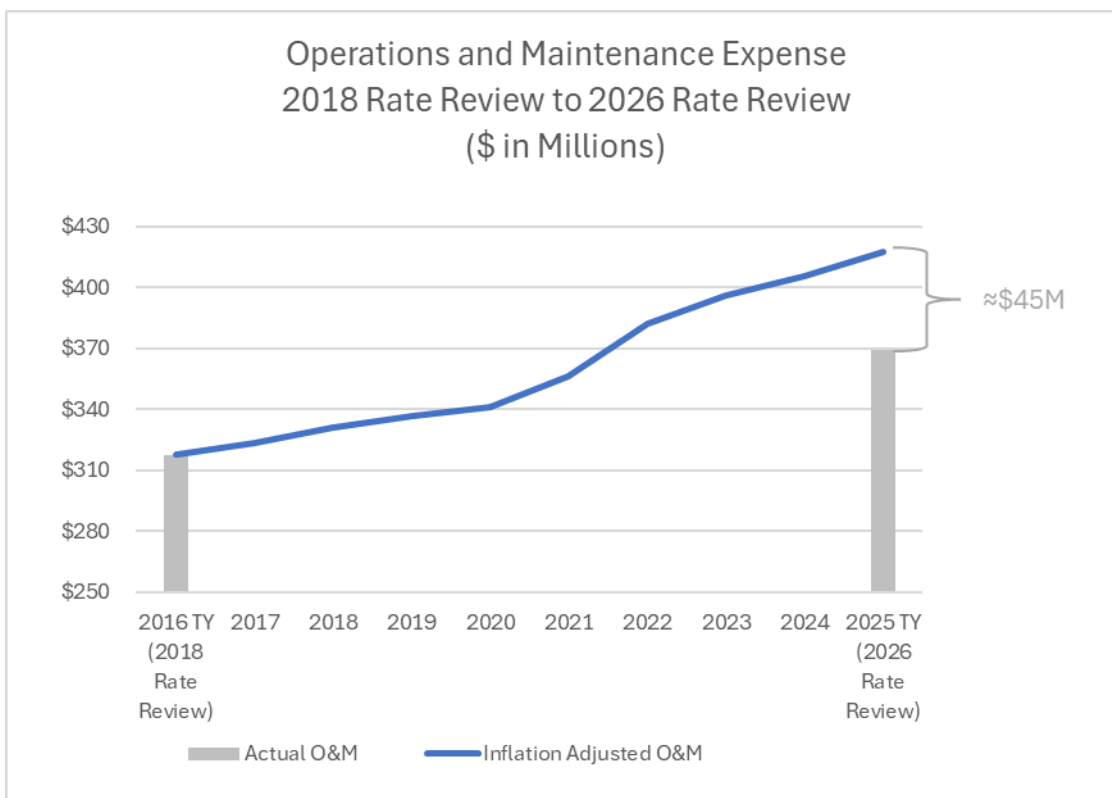
All else equal, the operation of the ESI has reduced the estimated, proposed monthly bill impact for the Company’s upcoming rate review by approximately 40 percent, from the range of an estimated \$40 per month to a range of an estimated \$25 per month, excluding the impact of major storm cost recovery.³ Due to a change in legislation enacted in 2023,⁴ the ESI will terminate as of the date of new rates are approved in the upcoming rate proceeding. However, in order to help stabilize future rates for customers, the Company expects to propose a performance-based multi-year rate plan to PURA that would leverage the valuable experience gained with the ESI and harness the strong stabilizing impact that more gradual increases produce for customers, as compared to larger aggregated base-revenue increases imposed every few years.

³ The Company is engaged in the process of developing the comprehensive analysis and documentation that is required for the rate filing and has not yet finalized the projected bill impacts associated with the final revenue deficiency to be filed with PURA. As a result, these estimated bill impacts are a preliminary projection subject to change in the actual filing.

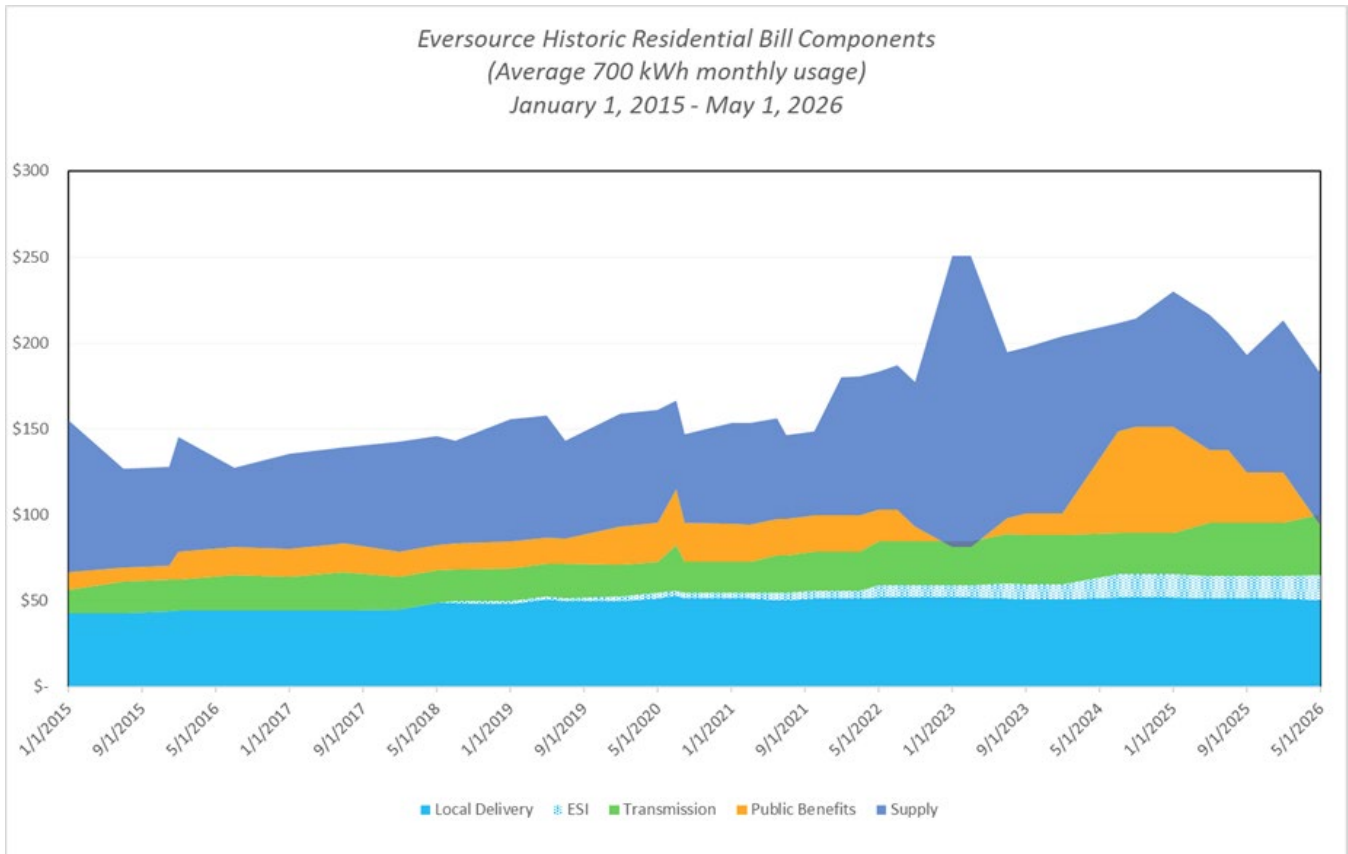
Figure 2: Operations & Maintenance Expense Trends

Second, the Company has worked diligently since PURA’s prior rate review to contain O&M expense by deploying rigorous budgetary and procurement controls across all operating functions, in addition to using other strategies to achieve operational efficiencies everywhere possible. This hard work has paid off for customers. The Company’s filing will show that inflation in the general economy, as measured by the Gross Domestic Product Price Index (“GDP-PI”), trended at approximately 30% over the period 2016 through 2025.⁵ By comparison, the Company’s O&M expense level has increased by approximately 16 percent over the same time frame, saving customers an estimated \$45 million per year, as compared to aggregate inflation trends. This dynamic is shown in Figure 2, below.

Still, there is no getting around the fact that amending the Company’s distribution rates will cause customers to experience an increase in their cost of electric service, currently estimated to be approximately 13 percent for the typical residential customer using 700 kWh per month on average, excluding the impact of recovering the outstanding balance of major storm costs. However, even if PURA were to adopt the Company’s proposed rate change *without modification*, the distribution portion of the customer bill would still remain well below \$100 monthly. As indicated in Figure 3, below, the combination of the current base rate and ESI rate is in the range of \$60 monthly.

A safe, reliable and resilient electric grid is the cornerstone of Connecticut’s economy and is vitally needed, not only to protect the safety and welfare of Connecticut residents, but also to enable the achievement of many other important goals, such as implementing Connecticut’s carbon-reduction and beneficial electrification goals and anchoring the development of affordable housing and economic growth that brings jobs and tax revenue. In the upcoming filing, Eversource will demonstrate its ongoing commitment to the vigorous and proactive pursuit of strategies to keep those parts of the customer bill over which Eversource has control in a space that is stable and affordable for customers, while at the same time providing PURA with proposals to sustain the integrity of distribution infrastructure and perpetuate good performance on operational and cost efficiency. These proposals will be integrated with a creative, holistic and in-depth plan to benefit customers over the long term.

⇒ **Recovery of Deferred Storm Costs from Docket No. 25-12-13.**

On December 15, 2025, PURA initiated a contested docket to review the Company's request for recovery of approximately \$1.4 billion of deferred storm restoration costs and associated carrying costs for 43 storm events and 10 pre-staging events occurring in the years 2018 through 2023.⁶ That docket, Docket No. 25-12-13, remains open and pending with a draft decision due to be issued on June 22, 2026 and a final decision noticed for July 29, 2026.

Because PURA's traditional ratemaking precedent contemplates the inclusion of storm costs in base distribution rates, following a comprehensive rate review, Eversource will need to include a request for recovery of the 2018-2023 storm costs and associated carrying costs as part of the upcoming rate filing to ensure that there is a path forward for recovery of that deferred amount. Recovery of the storm cost balance through base rates under PURA's traditional precedent would add approximately \$278 million annually to the Company's existing revenue level, bringing the total revenue request to approximately \$781 million annually.

Importantly, PURA's approval of a financing order to enable securitization of prudently incurred storm costs in Docket No. 26-04-04,⁷ would have the benefit of removing these costs from base distribution rates and eliminating the full carrying charge that the Company would need to collect to compensate for its actual costs. Securitization lowers the applicable interest rate and allows customers to pay back storm costs over a longer timeframe of up to 20 years, instead of six years, substantially reducing bill impacts for customers. Eversource estimates that securitization would reduce the bill impact for residential customers from approximately \$12 per month, under traditional cost recovery, to approximately \$4 per month, assuming a 20-year securitization term.

⇒ **Required Notice Provisions**

In accordance with PURA's regulations, Eversource is serving copies of this notice today by mail or personal delivery to the Governor of the State of Connecticut, the chief executive officers of every municipality located within the Company's franchise area, and the Office of Consumer Counsel.

In addition, as required by R.C.S.A. §§ 16-1-22(b) and 16-1-53a and by Paragraph 1.1 of PURA's Standard Filing Requirements for Large Public Utility Companies, the Company will request that PURA review and approve new distribution rates effective July 1, 2027, as follows:

1. Rate Amendment Application.
 - (a) The Company expects to present testimony, exhibits and documentation demonstrating a distribution revenue operating deficiency of approximately \$503 million for the 12-month Rate Year beginning July 1, 2027.
 - (b) Approval of the Company's proposed rates would represent an overall average increase on the customer bill of approximately 11 percent, as compared to currently authorized total revenues for all customers and rate classes combined. The change in the distribution revenue component of the customer bill is estimated at approximately 35 percent, as compared to currently authorized distribution revenues for all customers and rate classes combined.
 - (c) In addition, in the event that PURA does not authorize recovery of deferred storm costs for the period 2018-2023 through securitization in the separate proceeding in Docket No. 26-04-04, then PURA will need to authorize recovery of these deferred costs through the new distribution rates set in this proceeding, increasing the operating deficiency to approximately \$781 million for the 12-month Rate Year beginning July 1, 2027.
 - (d) Approval of new distribution rates that incorporate recovery of the 2018-2023 deferred storm costs and associated carrying costs would represent an overall average increase on the total customer bill of approximately 17 percent, as compared to currently authorized total revenues for all customers and rate classes combined. The change in the distribution revenue component of the customer bill is estimated at approximately 54 percent, as compared to currently authorized distribution revenues for all customers and rate classes combined.
2. Rates and Rate Design. The Company's request for rate relief will result in changes to various subcomponents of the Company's rates and rate design. The exact nature of any changes will ultimately depend upon the cost-recovery allocations determined by PURA in this and other related proceedings.
3. Service Area Applicability. The service area to be included in the application is as shown in Exhibit 1.
4. Municipalities Served. A list of the municipalities and the names and addresses of the municipal chief executive officers to whom this notice was sent is shown on Exhibit 2.
5. Test Year. The test year is the 12-month period ending December 31, 2025, and the date certain (last day of test year) is December 31, 2025.

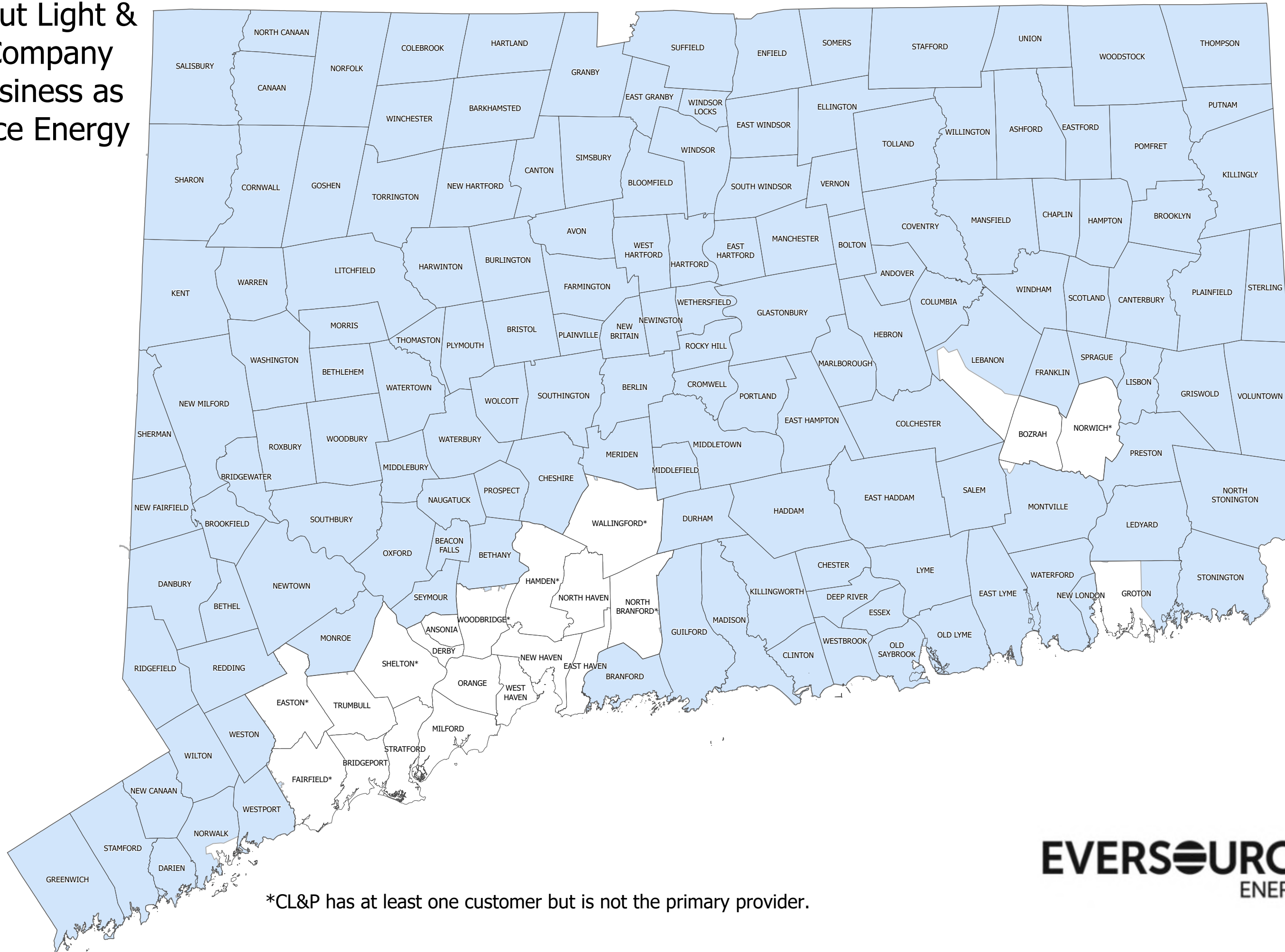
